

What is the **Safe Places** scheme?

The Safe Places scheme helps people while they are out and about. If someone feels unsafe or unsure, they have a safe place to go. It's free to join for members and venues!



What is a Safe Place?

Safe Places are venues where you can get short-term help while you are out in the community.

- cafes
- indoor markets
- libraries
- museums
- shops
- pubs
- leisure centres











What is a Safe Place?

Safe Place venues have agreed to join the scheme. **Barnsley Safe Places have checked the venues.** The staff have been trained to help you.

Barnsley Safe Places will have this sign in the window or entrance.





Why would I need a Safe Place?

Safe Places are there for when things go wrong. Or if you feel unsafe or unsure.

You may need time to calm down or help to contact a carer, friend or family.

Examples:

- I was harassed in the street
- I could not use my phone
- I lost my friends
- I broke my glasses
- My bank card would not work
- I felt ill

Some days you may cope well but on other days you might need help.

How do Safe Places venues help?

There are different ways venues help.

Just being there: Some members say they have not needed a Safe Place. But they feel safer knowing where they are.

You do not have to tell anyone: You do not have to tell staff you are using a Safe Place. Some people go into a shop or library to get away from what is upsetting them.

Help if you need it: All Barnsley Safe Places venues have been visited in the last 12 months. Staff have been trained to help you.



What should I expect?

All Safe Place venues should:

- Provide you with a place where you feel safe
- Ask what problem they can help you with
- Allow you to wait until you feel better or safe to leave
- Or help contact someone to collect you
- Call emergency services if needed

It would be helpful to venues if you carried your membership card. There is space for 2 phone numbers of people to call if you need help. It is the same size as a bank card.
